Riley Burked had an outstanding performance with 17 points -12 of those points came from 3-point range, Piper French helped with 5 points, 4 assists, and 5 rebounds, Kyla Hart led the team with 8 assists and brought down 3 rebounds. The Queens led 29-20 going into halftime. By the 3rd quarter they had pulled away by 14 points, a dominant 4th quarter by the Knights wasn't enough. The Queens won a well-fought match 58-54.

ViQueens met up with the Cowgirls on Tuesday night with a dominant win: 64-35. Lauren Johnson led the way with 20 points, 7 rebounds, and 3 steals. 40th Legislative Symposium & FFA Day at the Capitol

DES MOINES, IOWA—FFA members from across lowa converged on the Iowa State Capitol in Des Moines to build character and promote citizenship, volunteerism, and patriotism. More than 700 high school students wearing blue corduroy from 120 schools visited the Iowa State Capitol Building in Des Moines on January 22nd. The students visited with legislators, exhibited skills learned in the agriculture classroom and learned the importance of citizenship. This was all part of the 40th Annual Iowa FFA Legislative Symposium and FFA Day at the Capitol.

During the morning, FFA members gathered at the Downtown Embassy Suites for a brief greeting and tutorial. The program provided opportunities for FFA members to hear from Mike Naig, Iowa Secretary of Agriculture, about the importance of agriculture in Iowa and abroad. Iowa Farm Bureau Federation Vice President, Brian Feldpausch, then delivered a message about the importance young agriculturalists can play in the agriculture industry. Jake Swanson from High Yield Strategies then spoke about the importance of advocating for the agricultural industry.

This year six Stanton FFA members attended the Legislative Symposium: President, Clark Spencer; Vice President, Grant Spencer; Secretary, Gabe Kingery; Treasurer, Caed Olson; Reporter, Josi Strange; and Sentinel, Nick Herrick.


The HS Softball Team is doing a fundraiser with Dirt Road Candle Co out of Lewis, IA. The candles are 8 oz and come in the following scents:

From Nurse Stacy's Desk

Excessive screen time in children can negatively impact their development in various ways, including: hindering social skills, causing language delays, disrupting sleep patterns, promoting behavioral issues, contributing to obesity, decreasing attention span, impairing cognitive abilities, and potentially leading to emotional problems like anxiety and depression; essentially reducing time for active play and real-world interaction crucial for healthy development.

Key negative effects of excessive screen time on child development:

Social and emotional development issues

Language delays

Sleep disturbances
