We are going to be heading into allergy season soon. Here is some information on allergies vs a head cold.

Allergies and head colds are common respiratory conditions that can cause similar symptoms, but they have different underlying causes and treatments.

Cause:

Allergies: An immune reaction to a specific allergen, such as pollen, dust mites, or pet dander.

Head Cold: A viral infection caused by a rhinovirus.

Symptoms:

Common symptoms: Runny nose, sneezing, nasal congestion, watery eyes.

Allergies-specific symptoms: Itchy eyes, nose, and throat, persistent symptoms that may last for weeks or months.

Head cold-specific symptoms: Sore throat, body aches, fever, which usually resolve within 1-2 weeks.

Duration:

Allergies: Can last for as long as the allergen is present.

Head Cold: Typically lasts for 7-10 days.

Treatment:

Allergies: Avoiding allergens, antihistamines, nasal steroids, immunotherapy.

Head Cold: Rest, fluids, over-the-counter decongestants and pain relievers (if needed).

Other Considerations:

Allergies are not contagious, while head colds are.

Allergies can be seasonal, while head colds can occur any time of year.

People with allergies may have a history of other allergic conditions, such as asthma or eczema.

Kindergarten Round Up

Stanton Elementary School will conduct kindergarten assessments on Friday, March 28th for any child who will be five years of age on or before September 15, 2025.

On Thursday, March 27th, parents of incoming kindergarten students will meet at 5:30 in the elementary concourse.
